

### ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

The Dictionary of Texas Artists, 1800-1945 was truly a team effort. While we were the compilers and editors for the biographical and exhibition information, we were supplied with much of that same information by two teams: a Scholars Council made up of some of the leading scholars in the field of historic Texas art and listed in the introduction; and an Advisors Council comprising collectors, gallery dealers, and foundation members, also listed there. Both of these groups supplied important historical and biographical information, without which the project would have gone nowhere. Because so many people contributed, we hope to acknowledge those who went the extra mile. And to those whom we inadvertently fail to acknowledge, we sincerely apologize; please know that any omission is due only to the scale of this project.

Any major project requires a champion, and ours was Bill Cheek. Beginning to collect historic Texas art in the 1980s, he planned to write a dictionary of Texas art. He compiled important biographical information on Texas artists in general, with an emphasis on the artists represented in his collection. However, he soon realized that in order to accomplish a biographical tool useful to Texas art collectors, he needed some help. Hence, the dictio-

nary project was born. Bill Cheek has given generously, not only from his own pocketbook but also of a sometimes even more valuable resource—time. He wrote countless letters and placed innumerable telephone calls, FAXes, and e-mails, all to aid the dictionary. Furthermore, he organized the ever-changing Advisors Council of collectors and gallery owners and held their feet to the fire when lack of funding threatened the progress of the work. Moreover, Bill Cheek funded a color flyer about the project and hired historian and Edward G. Eisenlohr expert Diana Church to coordinate its design and mailing to all museums, libraries, and Texas art collectors in the state. Finally, he acted as initiator of the conversation between the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum and the Summerlee Foundation, which provided the financial backing for the research and completion of the dictionary. Without Bill Cheek, there would not be a Dictionary of Texas Artists.

The Summerlee Foundation of Dallas provided three ten-thousand-dollar grants for the project. John Crain and the foundation's trustees were unwavering supporters of it from its inception and we feel that their influence aided in convincing other foundations to add their support.

Knowing of the importance of images to such a project, Texas art collectors Richard and Nona Barrett of Dallas came to the rescue at an important juncture with an extremely bountiful grant.

Given its backing of regional art in Dallas during the 1930s and 1940s, through purchase prize monies for the Dallas Allied Arts Exhibitions, and its own Texas art collection, the A. H. Belo Foundation Corporation was a natural supporter for the project. Consequently, this foundation gave generously. The William P. Clements Foundation, with its focus on Southwestern history—evidenced by its recent founding of the Institute for Southwestern Studies at Southern Methodist University—also gave generously. Finally, a grant from the Robert J. and Helen C. Kleberg Foundation helped push the project "over the hump." Others who gave generously include Charles Attal, Robert Brousseau, David Dike Fine Art, David Lackey, Rainone Galleries, Robert Rork, Charles Stevens, and Russell Tether.

Among the Advisors Council members who provided information on artists, the following were especially helpful: Jim Baker, Bill Blakeley, David Dike, and Kevin Vogel.

Perhaps the greatest thrill in compiling the information was when we were lucky enough to have some of the artists themselves to respond to our queries. Those artists with whom we corresponded included Herring Coe; J. B. Erwin; Sister M. Tharsilla; Marjorie Johnson (Lee); Tom Lea; Octavio Medellin; and Donald Vogel. Artists descendants' were extremely helpful when we could find them, but none was more helpful than Holly Cox, daughter and granddaughter, respectively, of El Paso artists Eugene Thurston and Fern Thurston. She scoured the pages of the El Paso Woman's Clubs scrapbook and pored over the files of the El Paso Public Library, her hard work yielding previously unpublished detail about a large number of El Paso artists.

Among other artists' descendants who provided important information previously unknown were Jonelle Foster Bandy (Cecile Foster), Sudan, Texas; Margaret Bell Good (Fannie Taber Camp and Frances Camp Bell), Brownwood; W. A. McQuiddy (Elizabeth Johnson), Austin; Marlys M. Roos (Mado M. Prideaux), Atlanta, Georgia; and Willetta Stellmacher (Alice Melinda Cobb), Dallas.

Those who responded to our queries and sent information on various artists are listed in the "Letters" section of the bibliography. Particularly helpful were those

who either knew the artists intimately or had done their own research on various artists and were willing to share information throughout the project—Roger E. Saunders, New York; Richard Plumly, San Antonio; Samuel Shannon Blain Jr., Dallas; and A. C. Cook of Denton. As assistant to Jerry Bywaters on the Archives of American Art project in the 1970s, Samuel Blain came to know many of the artists in the Dallas area; he honed in on Olin Travis and has become *the* authority on Travis's work.

A. C. Cook's Hockshop Collection is the finest and most comprehensive Texas art collection anywhere. In addition to collecting art, Mr. Cook also collects archival material relating to Texas art. Although already committed to a similar Texas art reference project, he nevertheless provided us with meaningful biographical data. A. C. Cook and Bill Cheek have done more than anyone to promote Texas art.

We sent a statewide notice about our work and a request for information to all museums and libraries in Texas, a rather large number of institutions. While the response was not as successful as we had hoped it would be, we believe the lack of response from some institutions resulted from a lack of available material. However, several colleagues sent information readily. 

#### INTRODUCTION

Texas was not a mecca for artists during the first three-quarters of the nineteenth century. In fact, Frances Battaile Fisk, writing in her 1928 *A History of Texas Artists and Sculptors*—one of the earliest biographical listings of Texas artists—placed the beginning of Texas' art history proper at 1888, when portraits of the presidents of the republic and of governors were underwritten by the legislature. Fisk felt that "Texans of earlier generations were too occupied with the development of material resources . . . to have any leisure for the enjoyment of beauty."

Furthermore, not until the Fort Worth Art Association formed in 1884 did interested parties—led by women—begin developing art leagues and art associations throughout the state. Initially these groups held exhibitions that included some Texas pieces. However, by the mid-1890s exhibitions specifically for Texas art were held occasionally. Then, in 1910, the Fort Worth Art Association held the first annual Texas artists exhibition. Finally, Texas art was recognized as a genre.

The art history of Texas paralleled that of the rest of the United States. As Texans became more settled in the relatively new state, people found more leisure time and undertook more concerted efforts at cultural pursuits. Noted Texas artist and writer Jerry Bywaters wrote in 1936: "As a result of the rough and vigourous energy of pioneering in Texas, wealth began to accumulate, and with it came cultural pretensions—pretensions parallel to those of the wealthy New England ship-builder and trader, the Colonial planter, the Southern plantation-owner, and the California silver king. This was the Roman pride which, wishing itself preserved for posterity, turned to art for portraits of the grandees and their ladies."

Following the artist-explorers and military survey artists came academically trained European artists, who settled in the German and French communities of Central Texas. Later, itinerant portrait painters arrived, centering their work around Austin, Houston, and San Antonio. By the 1870s, American artists trained in Europe and the eastern United States had relocated to Texas. It was not until around 1900 that native Texan artists began coming to the fore. By the 1930s, eastern U.S. and European styles applied to Texas subjects were being supplanted by the work of artists seeking to synthesize a truly Texas style.

As Texas art came into its own, the first attempts at recording the area's art history also began in earnest. The first effort at a biographical listing of Texas artists was Goldie Capers Smith's 1926 book, *The Creative Arts in Texas*, with brief biographical sketches of select Texas artists, writers, and playwrights. Smith's work was quickly followed by Fisk's 1928 *History of Texas Artists and Sculptors*. Although Fisk listed no sources for her information, obviously much of what she compiled came from the artists themselves. Her history has become one of two standard references on Texas art, the other being Esse Forrester-O'Brien's *Art and Artists of Texas*, published in 1935.

From her home at Waco, O'Brien corresponded directly with living artists, who varied in their willingness to divulge pertinent biographical information. Generally, most of O'Brien's female correspondents neglected to provide a birth year, but nearly all artists were forthcoming about their training and exhibition records. O'Brien also used the artist files at the Witte Memorial Museum in San Antonio, which have since grown to become one of the finest archival collections in the state on Texas artists.

More than thirty years passed before another historian picked up the Texas art baton—albeit with a limited scope: Pauline Pinckney published *Painting in Texas: The Nineteenth Century* (1967). Given the focus of her study, Pinckney limited her research to early portrait painters, military survey artists, and European artists who immigrated to Texas in the mid-1800s.

Monographs on selected Texas artists began to appear in the 1960s, often not written by art historians. Two books on Dallas artist Frank Reaugh, for example, surfaced during this time, one written by J. Evetts Haley and another by two Reaugh students. An autobiography of Pompeo Coppini appeared in the mid-1950s.

The European-trained artists held sway with many of the early biographers, though James Patrick MacGuire of San Antonio published excellent monographs on Julius Stockfleth and Hermann Lungkwitz, respectively, while Cecilia Steinfeldt of the Witte Museum wrote her seminal study of the Onderdonk clan. Biographers also examined the careers of Richard Petri and Theodore Gentilz, and the San Antonio Museum Association produced a study of Carl G. von Iwonski.

However, the 1986 Texas Sesquicentennial spawned a new interest in artists of the state. Exhibitions and accompanying catalogues at the Witte Museum, the Dallas Museum of Art, and the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, helped light the fire that burns so intensely now.

In 1994, Dallas collector Bill Cheek approached the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum about spearheading an effort to produce a biographical publication on Texas artists. Given the PPHM's own collection of Texas art and its recent exhibition history focusing on the subject, the project was a natural fit for this museum. Furthermore, its curator of art, Michael R. Grauer, had a track record of publications on and curation of exhibitions of historic Texas art. Paula L. Grauer (a native Texan who comes from a long line of Texans from North, East, and West Texas), brought to the project a knowledge of computer databases, organizational skills, and experience as a columnist for the Canyon News-which required an ability at succinctness—all essential to the handling of the tremendous volume of data the project generated. The museum applied to the Summerlee Foundation of Dallas to begin work on a biographical listing of Texas artists and was awarded a grant of ten thousand dollars.

Scholars from important geographical locations in the state were invited to participate based on their own publications and interest in historic Texas art. Members of this group became the Scholars Council for the *Dictionary of Texas Artists* and were assigned to oversee all decisions regarding the scope of the project as well as the inclusion of artists. These scholars are Michael R. Grauer, of Canyon; Alison de Lima Greene, Houston; Sam Ratcliffe, Dallas; Becky Duval Reese, El Paso; Cecilia Steinfeldt, San Antonio; and Ron Tyler, Austin; Lise Darst of Galveston was invited to join after it became clear that Galveston required its own representative.

The first meeting of the Scholars Council for the *Dictionary of Texas Artists* was held at PPHM in September, 1994. The scope of the project was determined to take in all artists who lived in Texas and whose work had been included in at least one professional exhibition in the state prior to or during 1945. Throughout the duration of the project, the council met periodically and consulted constantly by telephone, letter, and electronic mail. The scholars also made resources available from their institutional as well as personal files and offered suggestions about other places and people to consult.

In June, 1997, the council met to jury images for reproduction in the book. More than four hundred images in the form of thirty-five-millimeter slides, larger transparencies, and photographic prints of varying quality were discussed over six hours. Later, the council determined that it would serve the project best to locate and reproduce as many images by lesser-known artists as possible; hence the large number of color reproductions here.

Working simultaneously with the Scholars Council was a group made up primarily of collectors and gallery dealers, called the Advisors Council, whose task was to aid in securing funding for the dictionary project and to make available their own files on Texas art. Texas collectors are often the only source for works by lesser-known artists. Consequently, several members of the Advisors Council were tapped to supply images for reproduction. Some advisors provided monies from their own pockets as well as cultivating other potential donors. The Advisors Council was as integral to the success of the project as were the scholars.


More than one hundred collectors and all the museums in Texas were contacted with requests for any biographical information on artists. One of the significant conclusions of this project is that, generally speaking, Texas public institutions have done a poor job in preserving the records of Texas artists.

Moreover, as a tangential result of research on exhi-

bitions, the authors have compiled the first indices to important pre-1945 Texas art exhibitions ever attempted. Unfortunately, much of the information on these exhibitions could not be located; hence the years and information missing from some of the entries in the exhibition lists (appendix B).

We remember the contributions of Stephen F. Austin and Sam Houston, Charles Goodnight and Quanah Parker, to the state of Texas, yet we are woefully ignorant of our own art history. In an effort to educate about historic Texas art, the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum began this project to compile comprehensive biographical data on artists who exhibited in Texas prior to 1945.

It is our sincerest hope that this reference will not only help us learn to appreciate more fully the variety of artists consistent with the vastness of the Lone Star State but also—and perhaps more important—that this book will be used as a springboard for additional research on Texas art, particularly through the encouragement of theses and dissertations at Texas universities and colleges. For if this project taught us nothing else, it confirmed that there is an enormous amount of work yet to be done.
